Census 2020 (James Rhodes-ACIP Planning Director)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Note: don't be scared of Census 2020 Goal of census 200 is to count everyone once and in the right place This is required by the US Constitution since 1790. Each person counted equates to approx. \$1,623 in federal funds (additional \$200 for state) and determines how many state representatives per state Updates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bethel doubled in population since 10 years ago and Greenville from ~40K to ~80K # of white population decreasing while Latino and African American population increasing West Greenville and Ayden are a few targeted areas with projected low participation Hard to count populations included children under 5, senior citizens, homeless, rural, and college students) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students in dorm on campus are counted as well but offsite areas are hard to count because parents may count them in their home state. There is some danger of being counted twice Anyone can fill out the census at the local library if internet access is unavailable. Word will be spread via social media, newspapers, newsletters, etc. New form is ONLY 9 questions Starting salary is \$14-\$20 for clerk, office supervisors, etc. (6-8mos position next year) DOES NOT qualify for SNAP requirements April 1 is Census Day!!! Community forms have been sent out that are different and done annually 	Go to the Census2020 website to self-respond. Volunteer or find information about calling in/paper forms. Trauma Informed Communities Initiative (Keith Letchworth)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be Trauma Informed. This means treating a whole person, taking into account past trauma and the resulting coping mechanisms when attempting to understand behaviors and treat the patient. BRACE (Building Resilience Against Adverse Childhood Experiences) is a good way to do this. Presented a form to get information on how the community can become more trauma informed (as professionals). 15-20 minutes online On January 27th there is a training called "Trauma informed 101". Will feature information on trauma, how to deal, and how to help others deal. Training is free of charge! Additional training will be available soon from Asheville One of the top needs of the community needs survey was secondary trauma. 	Stefanie will send out via email to fill out by January 21 st
