<p>*Across all three data sources there is strong evidence of need to assess economy. The survey results and focus group discussion analyses highlighted additional topics not ranked as top priorities in the secondary findings. A mixed methods approach is a strength when assessing a community as a whole. This process ensures robust findings through statistical analysis of health indicators and examinations of a constituent's perception of community health issues</p>
