This sentence put him in an environment that was drastically different and helped to shape his current way of thinking These experiences led to the formation of NC CIVIL (Community and Industry Value Interactionist League) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> NC CIVIL is your nonprofit community action group, specializing in outreach, citizen engagement, and partnership development for community based initiatives. It is an open platform for service learning, leadership development and corporate responsibility. A trusted and growing local brand of community and industry values at work for social good. Their community leadership model is constantly evolving through shared learning initiatives throughout the state and nation.
